

The Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law at Arizona State University invites applications for a Faculty Associate to teach in the Civil Justice Clinic and direct the Clinic's new Homeowner Advocacy Unit.

The Civil Justice Clinic operates year-round as a law firm within the College of Law, and has been in existence for over 40 years. Law students enrolled in this Clinic work with faculty supervisors to represent moderate, low and no-income clients, as well as non-profit organizations, in civil disputes, administrative hearings and policy matters. The Homeowner Advocacy Unit is a new component of the Clinic that will begin operations in the fall of 2011. Its mission will be to train law students and lawyers to represent homeowners who are at risk of defaulting on mortgage loans or facing foreclosure, or who are victims of mortgage fraud scams. The Homeowner Advocacy Unit is being created with the assistance of a three-year grant awarded by the Office of the Attorney General of Arizona.

The position of Faculty Associate is a non-tenure track faculty appointment. The Faculty Associate will be appointed for a one-year term that is renewable annually for up to three years, beginning June 1, 2011. In addition to supervising student attorneys' work on cases in the Homeowner Advocacy Unit, the Faculty Associate will help design and co-teach the seminar component of the Civil Justice Clinic, supervise student attorneys in other civil matters, such as unemployment insurance hearings, and engage in policy work and community outreach related to housing or mortgage issues. The salary for this position will be up to \$75,000 per year, depending on experience.

Candidates must possess a J.D. degree and be licensed to practice law. Demonstrated teaching ability and experience in related fields, such as consumer protection or real estate finance, are preferred. Full time employment will begin June 1, 2011.

The application deadline is March 15, 2011 and, if not filled, the fifteenth of each month thereafter until the search is closed.
